

2024 FESTIVAL PIPE ORGAN AND SOLO HANDBELLS SYLLABUS

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Festival Dates Wednesday, February 21 – Sunday, March 17, 2024

Deadline: November 1, 2023

Vocal and Instrumental Solo Entries \$30.00 per class (note: Recital Group and Concerto Entries \$40.00 per class) Musical Theatre, Operetta, and Gilbert & Sullivan Solo Entries \$30.00 per class

Deadline: December 1, 2023

Vocal and Instrumental Duet, Trio, Quartet and Ensemble Entries \$40.00 per class Musical Theatre, Operetta and Gilbert & Sullivan Duet, Trio, Quartet and Group Entries \$40.00 per class Community and School Entries \$60.00 per class

MANAGEMENT

- 1. The Winnipeg Music Festival Syllabus is compatible with the Associated Manitoba Arts Festivals Provincial Syllabus. In addition to the classes drawn from the provincial syllabus, there are also several classes unique to the Winnipeg Music Festival that meet local requirements.
- 2. All festival classes are under the working management of the Winnipeg Music Festival (hereinafter referred to as the WMF).
- 3. All matters not dealt with in these rules will be referred to the WMF, whose decisions are final.

ENTRIES AND ENTRY FEES

- The syllabus is available from our website at <u>www.winnipegmusicfestival.org</u>. Entry forms must be submitted through the online registration program.
- 5. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.
- 6. The WMF reserves the right to redirect entries to a more appropriate class. These redirections will be listed in the studio registration confirmation mailing sent to teachers.
- 7. No changes will be permitted once the entry has been filed.
- 8. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- Notification, including date, time and location of each class will be forwarded to the participant's teacher prior to the publication of the program. Teachers are responsible for advising their students of this information and to notify the office of any errors.
- 10. Participants and teachers are to notify the festival office of any change of personal information following submission of entry form.
- 11. Participants who wish to withdraw must notify the festival office in writing as early as possible.

ELIGIBILITY

- 12. All festival classes are open to amateur (non-professional) musicians who reside or study in the Province of Manitoba, and to amateur (non-professional) musicians who are residents of Manitoba studying outside the province.
- 13. An 'Amateur' is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the practice of music or from solo performance with the same instrument used for competition, although from time to time (but not on a full-time basis) such a person may receive remuneration for musical services rendered. A participant who qualifies as a professional for the purpose of a class is not precluded from qualifying as an amateur in other classes.
- 14. Conductors may be either professional or amateur. Conductors may conduct any number of organizations in the same class.
- 15. In all classes in which an age limit is prescribed, the age of the participant will be taken as of December 31, 2023. Duets should be entered in the class corresponding to the upper age or grade/level of the participants. Trios and groups should be entered in the class corresponding to the average age or grade of the participants. Chamber groups may have one member entered from one grade higher than the remainder of the group.
- 16. A participant's solo entries are restricted to one age group or grade per instrument.
- 17. Individual members of groups may perform with more than one entry; however, no repetition of repertoire will be permitted.
- 18. Substitutes will be allowed in duets, trios, ensembles and groups, subject to approval by the festival.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 19. Participants may not select and perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 20. Performing from memory is encouraged and strongly recommended in all performances.
- 21. No recorded accompaniment is allowed. Participants may apply to the office in writing to have this rule waived for selections scored with recorded accompaniment.
- 22. Accompanist requirements are the responsibility of the participant(s). Contact the Festival if you require assistance in finding an accompanist.
- 23. Accompaniment for soloists shall consist of a single instrument only. Instruments other than the piano may be used only if scored by the composer.

PHOTOCOPYING

24. Photocopying of copyright music is not allowed at this Festival, unless accompanied by written authorization from the publisher. The festival reserves the right to disqualify any participant for use of photocopies.

PROGRAM PROCEDURE

- 25. The WMF will decide the order in which participants perform. The festival reserves the right to alter the order, if necessary. Requests for changes to the program order must be sent in writing to the office for consideration. Program order will not be changed to accommodate accompanists.
- 26. The time of each class and the order of appearance will be shown in the official program. The program will be on sale at the WMF office and at selected music stores prior to the opening of the festival. Throughout the Festival weeks, programs may be purchased at the WMF office and at venue box offices during scheduled classes/events.
- 27. Participants are not allowed to practice in the performance area of a venue before a class.
- 28. All participants must provide original music for the adjudicator. Failure to do so will result in disqualification, with the participant receiving adjudication only. The music must be delivered immediately preceding the respective festival session or trophy competition. If legal downloads are used, a receipt for purchase or proof of 'public domain' must be presented with the copies (both for performer and collaborators) prior to the performance.
- 29. Numbering the first measure of each line is encouraged and strongly recommended. Performers competing at the provincial festival must number the measures.
- 30. Performance key, if different from the music provided, should be indicated.
- 31. All participants and collaborators must perform using original music. Failure to do so will result in disqualification, with the participant receiving adjudication only.
- 32. Participants may change the performance order of their pieces in any class requiring two or more selections.
- 33. Participants who are not ready to perform when called upon will be disqualified. If time allows, participants will be offered the opportunity to perform at the conclusion of the class for adjudication only.
- 34. Performances exceeding time limits stated in this syllabus will be disqualified and will receive adjudication only.
- 35. No one may approach the adjudicator while at their desk. Necessary questions from a participant must be directed to the adjudicator's assistant. Anyone who wishes to speak with the adjudicator following the sessions is asked to do so outside of the performance space. Please respect the adjudicator's limited break, travel, and mealtimes.
- 36. Adjudicator decisions are final.
- 37. Immediately following a class, all adjudication sheets, certificates, and music should be picked up. Any adjudication sheets and certificates not picked up will be available later at the WMF office. No adjudication sheets or certificates will be mailed, and the WMF assumes no responsibility for music left by participants.

TROPHIES

AUDIENCE

- 39. Participants and their accompanists will be allowed free admission to the sessions in which they are performing.
- 40. The public will be admitted to all venues in which festival classes and trophy competitions are being held upon paying admission.
- 41. No coaching from audience members is allowed.
- 42. Video or audio recording of individual performances, with permission from the participant (18 years +) and/or parent must be unobtrusive and silent. Adjudications may not be taped (video or audio) under any circumstances. No flash photography during performances.

PIPE ORGAN SOLO CLASSES

PIPE ORGAN

For each class, performers may select up to three pieces. If more than one piece is to be performed, the selections should represent different periods (Baroque, Romantic, 20th Century, etc.).

CLASS 2980 PIPE ORGAN, PRELIMINARY Own selection(s) up to and including Grade/Level 5. Original works for organ or harpsichord only (i.e. early French or English). Pedals required only where specified. **Time limit 10 minutes.**

CLASS 2981 PIPE ORGAN, JUNIOR Own selection(s). Grades/Levels 6-7. Original works for organ only. **Time limit 12 minutes.**

CLASS 2982 PIPE ORGAN, INTERMEDIATE Own selection(s). Grades/Levels 8-9. Original works for organ only. **Time limit 15 minutes.**

CLASS 2983 PIPE ORGAN, SENIOR Own selection(s). Grade/Level 10-Diploma. Original works for organ only. **Time limit 20 minutes.**

CLASS 8663 HANDBELL SOLO, OWN CHOICE, 19 YEARS AND UNDER Two contrasting selections, own choice.

CLASS 8664 HANDBELL SOLO, OWN CHOICE, OPEN Two contrasting selections, own choice.
