GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Festival Dates Wednesday, February 21 – Sunday, March 17, 2024

Deadline: November 1, 2023

Musical Theatre, Operetta and Gilbert & Sullivan Duet, Trio, Quartet and Group Entries \$40.00 per class

MANAGEMENT

- 1. The Winnipeg Music Festival Syllabus is compatible with the Associated Manitoba Arts Festivals Provincial Syllabus. In addition to the classes drawn from the provincial syllabus, there are also several classes unique to the Winnipeg Music Festival that meet local requirements.
- 2. All festival classes are under the working management of the Winnipeg Music Festival (hereinafter referred to as the WMF).
- 3. All matters not dealt with in these rules will be referred to the WMF, whose decisions are final.

ENTRIES AND ENTRY FEES

- The syllabus is available from our website at <u>www.winnipegmusicfestival.org</u>. Entry forms must be submitted through the online registration program.
- 5. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.
- 6. The WMF reserves the right to redirect entries to a more appropriate class. These redirections will be listed in the studio registration confirmation mailing sent to teachers.
- 7. No changes will be permitted once the entry has been filed.
- 8. Entry fees are non-refundable.
- 9. Notification, including date, time and location of each class will be forwarded to the participant's teacher prior to the publication of the program. Teachers are responsible for advising their students of this information and to notify the office of any errors.
- 10. Participants and teachers are to notify the festival office of any change of personal information following submission of entry form.
- 11. Participants who wish to withdraw must notify the festival office in writing as early as possible.

ELIGIBILITY

- 12. All festival classes are open to amateur (non-professional) musicians who reside or study in the Province of Manitoba, and to amateur (non-professional) musicians who are residents of Manitoba studying outside the province.
- 13. An 'Amateur' is defined as a person whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the practice of music or from solo performance with the same instrument used for competition, although from time to time (but not on a full-time basis) such a person may receive remuneration for musical services rendered. A participant who qualifies as a professional for the purpose of a class is not precluded from qualifying as an amateur in other classes.
- 14. Conductors may be either professional or amateur. Conductors may conduct any number of organizations in the same class.
- 15. In all classes in which an age limit is prescribed, the age of the participant will be taken as of December 31, 2023. Duets should be entered in the class corresponding to the upper age or grade/level of the participants. Trios and groups should be entered in the class corresponding to the average age or grade of the participants. Chamber groups may have one member entered from one grade higher than the remainder of the group.
- 16. A participant's solo entries are restricted to one age group or grade per instrument.
- 17. Individual members of groups may perform with more than one entry; however, no repetition of repertoire will be permitted.
- 18. Substitutes will be allowed in duets, trios, ensembles and groups, subject to approval by the festival.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- 19. Participants may not select and perform the same piece in more than one class.
- 20. Performing from memory is encouraged and strongly recommended in all performances.
- 21. No recorded accompaniment is allowed. Participants may apply to the office in writing to have this rule waived for selections scored with recorded accompaniment.
- 22. Accompanist requirements are the responsibility of the participant(s). Contact the Festival if you require assistance in finding an accompanist.
- Accompaniment for soloists shall consist of a single instrument only. Instruments other than the piano may be used only if scored by the composer.

PHOTOCOPYING

24. Photocopying of copyright music is not allowed at this Festival, unless accompanied by written authorization from the publisher. The festival reserves the right to disqualify any participant for use of photocopies.

PROGRAM PROCEDURE

- 25. The WMF will decide the order in which participants perform. The festival reserves the right to alter the order, if necessary. Requests for changes to the program order must be sent in writing to the office for consideration. Program order will not be changed to accommodate accompanists.
- 26. The time of each class and the order of appearance will be shown in the official program. The program will be on sale at the WMF office and at selected music stores prior to the opening of the festival. Throughout the Festival weeks, programs may be purchased at the WMF office and at venue box offices during scheduled classes/events.
- 27. Participants are not allowed to practice in the performance area of a venue before a class.
- 28. All participants must provide original music for the adjudicator. Failure to do so will result in disqualification, with the participant receiving adjudication only. The music must be delivered immediately preceding the respective festival session or trophy competition. If legal downloads are used, a receipt for purchase or proof of 'public domain' must be presented with the copies (both for performer and collaborators) prior to the performance.
- 29. Numbering the first measure of each line is encouraged and strongly recommended. Performers competing at the provincial festival must number the measures.
- 30. Performance key, if different from the music provided, should be indicated.
- 31. All participants and collaborators must perform using original music. Failure to do so will result in disqualification, with the participant receiving adjudication only.
- 32. Participants may change the performance order of their pieces in any class requiring two or more selections.
- 33. Participants who are not ready to perform when called upon will be disqualified. If time allows, participants will be offered the opportunity to perform at the conclusion of the class for adjudication only.
- 34. Performances exceeding time limits stated in this syllabus will be disqualified and will receive adjudication only.
- 35. No one may approach the adjudicator while at their desk. Necessary questions from a participant must be directed to the adjudicator's assistant. Anyone who wishes to speak with the adjudicator following the sessions is asked to do so outside of the performance space. Please respect the adjudicator's limited break, travel, and mealtimes.
- 36. Adjudicator decisions are final.
- 37. Immediately following a class, all adjudication sheets, certificates, and music should be picked up. Any adjudication sheets and certificates not picked up will be available later at the WMF office. No adjudication sheets or certificates will be mailed, and the WMF assumes no responsibility for music left by participants.

TROPHIES

38. See Trophy Rules and Regulations.

AUDIENCE

- 39. Participants and their accompanists will be allowed free admission to the sessions in which they are performing.
- 40. The public will be admitted to all venues in which festival classes and trophy competitions are being held upon paying admission.
- 41. No coaching from audience members is allowed.
- 42. Video or audio recording of individual performances, with permission from the participant (18 years +) and/or parent must be unobtrusive and silent. Adjudications may not be taped (video or audio) under any circumstances. No flash photography during performances.

TROPHY RULES AND REGULATIONS

All shields and trophies are the property of the Winnipeg Music Festival. Trophy winners will receive a plaque to retain as a permanent record of their achievement and their names will be engraved on the original trophy or shield. Competitive trophies are presented following a competition and are designated by an asterisk (*) following the trophy name. Winners of awarded trophies will be notified regarding presentation following the conclusion of eligible class(es). In addition to the following rules, please see individual trophy descriptions.

COMPETITIVE TROPHY RULES

- Recipients of instrumental competitive trophies are not eligible to enter classes at the same grade in succeeding Festivals unless competing in a class requiring performance on a different instrument to that previously used.
- 2. A minimum mark of 87 is required by participants securing first place in an eligible class for entrance into all trophy competitions.
- 3. A participant who has qualified by securing first place in more than one eligible class may compete only once and must elect which of the eligible classes he or she represents. A participant may perform more than once in a trophy class if they are performing on different instruments.
- 4. To be eligible for trophy competitions, participants must be recommended from a trophy eligible class and enter and perform in one additional solo class with the same instrument.
- 5. For all trophy competitions, participants must provide original music for the use of the adjudicator.
- 6. The adjudicator will announce the winner and runner(s)-up only. No marks will be awarded.

AWARDED TROPHY RULES

- 1. Recipients of awarded trophies are eligible for the same award in subsequent festivals.
- 2. A minimum mark of 87 or achievement of a silver level is required for eligibility.

INSTRUMENTAL TROPHIES

PARTICIPANTS IN PIANO CLASSES ARE ELIGIBLE FOR:

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR'S TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding performance, solo or group, during the current year's festival. This trophy is presented at the Gala Concert.

KOZUB TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding performance by a vocal/instrumental group, family and/or friends, in class 1945, as selected by the adjudicator(s).

JEAN BROADFOOT TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding performance in a Piano Sonata Class, Grade/Level 9 to Honours, in classes 2452, 2455, 2458, 2502, 2505, 2508, 2552, 2555, 2602, 2605, and 2608, as selected by the adjudicator. This trophy is presented at the Aikins Memorial Trophy competition.

JOHN MELNYK TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding performance in a Piano Concerto Class, Grade/Level 8 to Honours, in classes 2421, 2471, 2521, 2571 and 2621, as selected by the adjudicator. This trophy is presented at the Aikins Memorial Trophy competition.

ROYAL CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC ALUMNI ASSOCIATION WINNIPEG CHAPTER TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding solo Piano performance, Grade/Level 9 to Honours, as selected by the adjudicator. This trophy is presented at the Aikins Memorial Trophy competition.

CLARE C. LECKIE TROPHY

Award for the most outstanding performance in a Piano Group Class, in classes 2701, 2702, 2703, 2704, 2705, 2706, 2707, 2708, 2721, 2722, 2723, 2724, 2741, 2742, 2743, 2744, 2761, 2762, 2763 and 2764.

GRADE/LEVEL 5

QUEST MUSIQUE TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 5 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece with which they won the class they are representing.

GRADE/LEVEL 6

INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED PIANO TUNERS OF MANITOBA TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 6 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece with which they won the class they are representing.

GRADE/LEVEL 7

SWEDISH MUSICAL CLUB TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 7 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece with which they won the class they are representing.

Piano: 2351, 2352, 2353, 2354, 2355, 2356, 2357 and 2358

GRADE/LEVEL 8

MANITOBA MUSIC TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 8 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece with which they won the class they are representing.

Piano: 2401, 2402, 2403, 2404, 2405, 2406, 2407, 2408, 2409, 2410 and 2411

GRADE/LEVEL 9

JUNIOR MUSICAL CLUB TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 9 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece with which they won the class they are representing.

Piano: 2451, 2452, 2453, 2454, 2455, 2456, 2457A, 2457B, 2458, 2459 and 2461

GRADE/LEVEL 10

BERYL FERGUSON MEMORIAL TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Grade/Level 10 classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece or a portion thereof if time constraints require, with which they won the class they are representing.

Time limit 8 minutes.

Piano: 2501, 2502, 2503, 2504, 2505, 2506A, 2506B, 2507A, 2507B, 2508, 2509 and 2511

DIPLOMA

AIKINS MEMORIAL TROPHY*

This class will include the most outstanding performers from the following Diploma level classes. Participants are required to perform only the piece or a portion thereof if time constraints require, with which they won the class they are representing.

Time limit 10 minutes.

Piano: 2551, 2552, 2553, 2554, 2555, 2556A, 2556B, 2557A, 2557B, 2558, 2559, 2560 and 2561

PIANO NOTES AND REGULATIONS

In addition to the following discipline specific information, please refer to the general rules and regulations. For trophy competition eligibility, please refer to the trophy rules and regulations.

20TH CENTURY COMPOSITIONS 1900-1970 (Grades/Levels 9, 10, Diploma & Honours):

Selections composed in the years 1900-1970. Works by Late Romantic Composers must be entered in the Romantic class. Works by French composers must be entered in the French Composers class. Works by Canadian composers must be entered in the Canadian Composers class.

20TH/21ST CENTURY COMPOSERS: Music of the 20th/21st century.

20TH/21ST CENTURY COMPOSITIONS 1971 TO PRESENT (Grades/Levels 10, Diploma & Honours):

Selections composed in the years 1971 to present. Works by French composers must be entered in the French Composers class. Works by Canadian composers must be entered in the Canadian Composers class.

BAROQUE COMPOSERS: Music of the Baroque period.

CANADIAN COMPOSERS: For extensive listings of music by Canadian composers, refer to the Contemporary Showcase Syllabus www.acnmp.ca or the Canadian Music Centre www.musiccentre.ca.

CLASSICAL COMPOSERS: Music of the Classical period. Where there are two classes for Classical era compositions, one class is for sonata/sonatina/divertimento movements only and the other is for all other compositions from the Classical era (e.g. bagatelles, theme & variations).

CONCERTO: Concerto classes are understood to include concerto, concertino, and multi-movement concerted works. Movements from these works must be entered in Concerto classes.

EARLY ROMANTIC COMPOSERS (Grade/Level 10, Diploma & Honours): Music of the Early Romantic Period.

GRADE/LEVEL: Repertoire graded by RCM/CC must be performed at the grade(s)/level(s) listed in their current syllabi. Ungraded repertoire should be equal in difficulty to graded repertoire performed in the same class(es).

LATE ROMANTIC COMPOSERS (Grade/Level 10, Diploma and Honours): Music of the Late Romantic Period. A selection from the works of such composers as Albéniz, Glière, Granados, Janáček, MacDowell, Medtner, Moszkowski, Rachmaninoff, Scriabin, etc.

POPULAR/CONTEMPORARY: Works, current or written in recent decades, from a wide variety of styles and genres other than those offered in this syllabus (e.g. blues, contemporary folk and sacred, country, jazz, hip-hop, pop, rock, etc.). These works may be published or original arrangements and may be self-composed and/or self-accompanied.

RECITAL GROUP: Two or three selections by one or more composers, one of which may be a sonata movement. No concerto movements. Participants will be adjudicated on the selection of the group: technique, style, and interpretation. The purpose of this class is to provide an opportunity for students to prepare and perform a recital program in public. Participants will receive adjudication only. Time limits must be observed.

REPEATS: In sonatina/sonata and concerto classes, repeats are NOT to be played. Repeats in other classes are to be used at the discretion of the student/teacher. Da capo markings are to be observed.

REPERTOIRE EXCEPTIONS: The following selections will be allowed as ONE selection in solo piano classes. Participants choosing to perform any of the Grade/Level 10 and Diploma level selections listed below must be prepared to 'cut' their selection, as applicable, to meet the Beryl Ferguson Memorial Trophy 8-minute time limit and the Aikins Memorial Trophy 10-minute time limit. Selections other than those listed will be considered for future festivals.

ROMANTIC COMPOSERS (Grades/Levels 3-9): Music of the Romantic Period. The music of Sergei Rachmaninoff is regarded as music of this era.

SELECTION: Unless otherwise indicated in THIS syllabus, the word selection refers to:

- One piece by a composer, and not two or more short pieces from a collection or cycle.
- One movement of a larger work such as a suite or sonata.

SONATA: Sonata classes are understood to include sonata, sonatina and divertimento. Movements from these works must be entered in Sonata classes. One sonata movement may be played in the Recital Group class.

CLASS 2004 PIANO SOLO, BEGINNER, OPEN

One selection, own choice from a beginner method book or or a pre-grade/level book (RCM/CC).

CLASS 2005 PIANO SOLO, CANADIAN COMPOSERS, BEGINNER

One selection, own choice.

CLASS 2006 PIANO SOLO, POPULAR/CONTEMPORARY, BEGINNER

One selection, own choice.
